

**Stathis Selimis**, PhD (2007), National and Kapodistrian University of Athens, is an Associate Professor of Linguistics (Language Acquisition) at the University of Peloponnese, School of Health Sciences, Department of Speech and Language Therapy (Chair from 9/2021 until 8/2023). He has also served as a Coordinator of the postgraduate module *Language Acquisition* at the Hellenic Open University in the Master's Program "Education Sciences: Special education for people with oral and written language

difficulties" (joint with the University of Thessaly). His academic interests include first and second language acquisition with a focus on semantic and pragmatic aspects, and the relationship between language and cognition. His publications include articles in international scientific journals such as *Language Learning and Development* (Taylor & Francis), *Language, Cognition and Neuroscience* (Taylor & Francis), *Cognitive Neuropsychology* (Taylor & Francis), *Corpus Pragmatics* (Springer) and *Journal of Pragmatics* (Elsevier). He has recently co-edited a collective volume (Athens, Gutenberg Publishing) on bi/multilingual language development and educational considerations (in Greek). He is a member of the Hellenic Psychological Society and of the Hellenic Cognitive Science Society.
